Notice of Race

- **RULES** 1
- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 The Organizing Authority (OA) is Royal Vancouver Yacht Club (RVanYC)
- 1.3 The Canadian prescriptions that apply will be posted on the event web site.
- 1.4 A boat that may have broken a rule of Part 2 while racing may take a One-Turn Penalty. However, if a boat breaks a rule of Part 2 within the Zone of any rounding or finishing mark, her penalty shall be a Two-Turns Penalty.
- 1.5 Rule 40.1 (Personal Flotation Devices) will apply.
- 1.6 Appendix P will apply. Rule P2.3 and P2.2 will not apply, and rule P2.1 is changed so that it will apply to any penalty.
- 2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and Supplementary Sailing Instructions that will be posted on the official notice board.

4 SOCIAL PROGRAM

It is expected that there will be a regatta dinner on Saturday evening at 1730 on the main floor of the clubhouse. Tickets will be available on the event web site.

After racing snacks will be served on Sunday before prizegiving.

ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

5.1 The event is open to all boats of these classes

> Club 420 Martin 16 29er Optimist ILCA 4 (Laser 4.7) Optimist Green

RS Feva ILCA 6 (Laser Radial)

ILCA 7 (Laser)

5.2 Competitors in the Optimist class shall have been born between 2008 and 2017 and are assigned to fleets as follows:

Red fleet Born in 2010 or before Blue fleet Born in 2011 or 2012 White fleet Born in 2013 to 2016 Green fleet Born in 2017 or Novice

Competitors born in 2017 are assigned to the Green fleet and must have a designated coach while on the water.

- 5.3 Boats may enter the event by registering online at the event web site before midnight on Thursday, June 15.
- To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 5.5 Late entries will be accepted until midnight on Friday, June 16 and are subject to an additional fee. On-site entries may be accepted during check-in at the OA's discretion but are strongly discouraged.

- 7.4 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be displayed after 1530.
- 8 SAIL NUMBER INSPECTION
- 8.1 Each boat shall produce its mainsail for inspection on the front lawn of the club during the times specified above.
- 8.2 Boats may be inspected at any time.
- 9 VENUE

Attachment A shows the location of the racing areas.

10 COURSES

Courses will be windward-leeward.

- 11 SCORING
- 11.1 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
 - a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - b) When 5 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 12 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS
- 12.1 [DP] Support person vessels shall be marked with flags provided by the OA.
- 12.2 [DP] Coaches and other support persons intending to go on the water during the event must register on the event web site.
- 12.3 [DP] Coach boats must be equipped with an operating VHF radio and drivers musts be attached to a functioning engine shut off switch at all times.
- 13 REPLACEMENT OF CREW

[DP] Substitution of competitors is not allowed without prior written approval of the race committee.

14 BERTHING

Competitors are welcome to bring their boats to the club for the weekend. Please follow the instructions of the wharfingers and greeters on arrival.

[DP] Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while on the dock or marina.

15 MEDIA RIGHTS.

By participating in the event competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority and its sponsors the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any still or motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.

16 RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas,

sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

17 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 3, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta

18 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$1,000,000 per incident for Canadian boats and USD \$300,000 for boats from elsewhere.
